## eBooks

We have expanded our download collection to include eBooks at our OverDrive site! On the site, you can browse the collection, check out and download ebooks and more anytime, anywhere. eBooks can be read on a PC or Mac using free reader software. They can also be transferred to popular e-reading devices like the Sony Reader, the Barnes & Noble Nook and the Kobo eReader.

To check out eBooks or audio books, you just

need a valid library card, a computer and an internet connection. Once downloaded you can transfer the digital media to MP3 players, ipods and more!

Just go to our library website and click on the 'download audio books' link. Click on 'my account', select Wahoo Public Library and enter your library card number. Then, start downloading!
