Wahoo, Nebraska

The Council met in regular session in the Wahoo Public Library, 637 N Maple, in compliance with agenda posted at City Hall, Post Office and First Bank of Nebraska, and the City of Wahoo website, with each Council member being notified of agenda prior to the meeting. The meeting was called to order by Mayor Gerald D. Johnson at 7:00 p.m. and opened with the Pledge of Allegiance. The public was informed of the location of posting of the Open Meetings Law. Roll call was taken with the following Council members present: Stuart Krejci, Ryan Ideus, Carl Warford, Chris Rappl, Karen Boop and Patrick Nagle.

Police Chief Baudler reported that a run to raise funds for Teammates was a big success.

City Administrator Harrell reported that the budget for the 2022-23 fiscal year and been presented to the council and approved. She also reported on the status of the various projects stating that the Safe Routes to School project was officially complete.

Council Member Warford motioned, and Council Member Krejci seconded to approve the Consent Agenda which included the following; Approval of Minutes of August 23rd, 2022, meeting of the City Council, Approval of Minutes of September 1<sup>st</sup>, 2022, meeting of the Planning Commission, Approval of Pay App #4 for the 2022 Asphalt Overlay Project to M.E. Collins in the amount of \$147,650.90, Approval of Part-time building inspector Job description and pay scale. Roll call vote Warford, yes; Krejci, yes; Ideus, yes; Boop, yes; Rappl, yes; and Nagle, yes. Motion carried.

Ordinance No. 2395 was introduced by Council Member Krejci entitled: AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF WAHOO, SAUNDERS COUNTY, NEBRASKA, TO VACATE A PORTION OF A STREET, SAID PUBLIC WAY TO BE VACATED BEING DESCRIBED AS FOLLOWS: THAT PORTION OF DEDICATED FOURTH STREET LYING WEST OF LOCUST STREET BETWEEN BLOCKS 29 AND 30, COUNTY ADDITION TO THE CITY OF WAHOO, SAUNDERS COUNTY, NEBRASKA; AND TO RETAIN OWNERSHIP IN FAVOR OF THE CITY OF WAHOO, NEBRASKA, FOR THE PURPOSE OF INGRESS AND EGRESS OVER, ACROSS, AND UNDER THE ABOVE-DESCRIBED REAL ESTATE FOR THE PURPOSE OF SURVEYING, CONSTRUCTING, RELOCATING, ALTERING, INSPECTING, REPAIRING, REPLACING, ADDING TO, MAINTAINING AND OPERATING, AT ANY TIME, UTILITIES OR ANY OTHER PHYSICAL CITY IMPROVEMENT, WITH APPURTENANCES AND ACCESSORIES THERETO, THEREIN OR IN THE FUTURE LOCATED THEREIN; TO APPROVE THE WAIVER OF THE APPOINTMENT OF A SPECIAL COMMISSION TO ASCERTAIN THE AMOUNT OF SPECIAL DAMAGES TO THE ABUTTING PROPERTY OWNERS OF THE VACATED STREET AS CONTAINED WITHIN §95.067 OF THE WAHOO MUNICIPAL CODE.

Harry Falke of 630 W 1<sup>st</sup> Street asked what would happen to the area if it was vacated. City Administrator Harrell reported that the City would maintain ownership but that it would no longer be a plated road and that the master trail plan does have a trail going through that location in the future.

Council Member Krejci motioned that the statutory rules in regard to the passage and adoption of ordinances be suspended so that the said ordinance might be introduced, read by title, and then moved for final passage at the same meeting. Council Member Nagel seconded said motion. The Mayor put the question and instructed the Clerk to call for the roll for the vote thereon. The Clerk called the roll, and the following was the vote on the motion to suspend the rules: Roll call vote Krejci, yes; Nagle, yes;

Boop, yes; Warford, yes; Ideus, yes; and Rappl, yes. Motion carried. The motion having been carried by the affirmative votes of no less than three-fourths of the members of the Council, the Mayor declared the statutory rules in regard to the passage and approval of ordinance be suspended so that Ordinance No. 2395 may be read by title and moved for final passage in the same meeting.

Council Member Krejci moved that Ordinance No. 2395 be approved and passed, and its title agreed to. Council Member Warford seconded the motion. The Mayor instructed the Clerk to call the roll for the vote and the following was the vote on this motion: Roll call vote Krejci, yes; Ideus, yes; Boop, yes; Warford, yes; Rappl, yes; and Nagle, yes. Motion carried.

Ordinance No. 2396 was introduced by Council Member Warford entitled: AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF WAHOO, SAUNDERS COUNTY, NEBRASKA, TO AMEND THE OFFICIAL ZONING MAP OF THE CITY OF WAHOO, NEBRASKA, PERTAINING TO THE FOLLOWING-DESCRIBED REAL ESTATE, TO WIT: WEST 31 ½ FEET OF LOT 6, BLOCK 153, COUNTY ADDITION TO THE CITY OF WAHOO, SAUNDERS COUNTY, NEBRASKA BY ALLOWING THEREON A PERMITTED CONDITIONAL USE, THAT BEING DEVELOPMENT OF A COLD AND DRY STORAGE AND FRONT OFFICE RETAIL, AS ALLOWED BY PERMITTED CONDITIONAL USES LISTED UNDER C-1 DOWNTOWN COMMERICAL ZONING DISTRICT OF WAHOO ZONING REGULATIONS SECTION 5.12.03. Council Member Warford motion to approve the first reading of Ordinance No 2396, Council Member Rappl seconded. Roll call vote Warford, yes; Rappl, yes; Krejci, yes; Nagle, yes; Ideus, yes; and Boop, yes. Motion carried.

Council Member Krejci motioned, and Council Member Ideus seconded to approve a contract with One Billing Solutions for EMS Billing. Roll call vote Krejci, yes; Ideus, yes; Boop, yes; Warford, yes; Rappl, yes; and Nagle, yes. Motion carried

Council Member Krejci motioned, and Council Member Nagel seconded to approve Resolution No 2022-17 Amending Attachment 5 of the Master Fee Schedule for Parks and Rec fees and charges and Attachment 6 Rescue Squad fees and charges.
