MONTHLY REPORT

April, 2023

Building Maintenance

Inspections completed during the month included the fire extinguishers at all City buildings as well as the backflow preventer inspections. Repair work included replacing the Civic Center pool exhaust fan motor and cleaning the Senior Center sewer line.

Parks

Work continued to re-open all parks and outdoor facilities for the season. All park shelters and restrooms were opened and made available early in the month as the weather began to cooperate. High school baseball games at Crawford and Hackberry were consistent throughout the month and the local club teams began playing at Hackberry as well mid-month so field preparation work was a daily activity. Regular spring pre-emergent applications occurred at Crawford and Hackberry. Irrigation systems at all facilities were turned on and programmed for the season. Five large trees were removed at Smith Park as part of our continued effort to identify and remove trees in poor condition. Staff assisted the contracted tree company to clean up the sites. All stumps were also removed. Landscaped areas at the Civic Center and along the Maple St. trail received some clean up and pruning attention. Two new flag poles will be installed at Crawford and the south fields at Hackberry thanks to a generous local donor. Staff formed and poured the concrete foundations for both poles and they will be set in the near future.

The Council met in regular session in the Wahoo Public Library, 637 N Maple, in compliance with the agenda posted at City Hall, Post Office and First Bank of Nebraska, and the City of Wahoo website, with each Council member being notified of the agenda prior to the meeting. The meeting was called to order by Mayor Gerald D. Johnson at 7:00 p.m. and opened with the Pledge of Allegiance. The public was informed of the location of posting of the Open Meetings Law. Roll call was taken with the following Council members present: Stuart Krejci, Chris Rappl, Patrick Nagle and Ryan Ideus, Carl Warford, and Shane Sweet. Council Members absent: None.

Library Director Denise Lawver gave a report on the 100th anniversary celebration and the upcoming kick off for the summer reading program that will run from May 22nd through July 28.

City Administrator Melissa Harrell reported on the upcoming Open House for the 77/109 roundabout project. She also reported on the status of other projects throughout the city.

Council Member Nagle motioned and Council Member Ideus seconded to approve the consent agenda which included approval of minutes of the April 20, 2023, work session of the City Council, acceptance of the April 6, 2023, meeting of the planning commission, and approval of drawdown #11 for \$19,228.75 including approval of claims for payment from SENDD for \$1,593.75 for Administration, \$850.00 to SENDD for Housing Management, \$2,055.00 to SENDD for Lead, \$7980.00 to Crewline Exteriors, and \$6,750.00 to Welch Masonry. Utilities General Manager Ryan Hurst reported that our current allowed rate for customer owned generation is 100Kw and that this purposed ordinance would decrease that to 25Kw. This would make our policy in line with state statute. Council Member Krejci introduced Ordinance No 2433, an amendment to rate change policy regarding customer owned generation excess power rate. Council Member Krejci motioned, and Council Member Warford seconded to waive the required three readings. Council Member Krejci motioned, and Council Member Warford seconded to approve Ordinance No 2433.

Council Member Krejci motioned, and Council Member Nagle seconded to deny the claim regarding a sewer backup at 1025 N Hackberry. Roll call vote Krejci, yes; Nagle, yes; Sweet, yes; Warford, yes; Ideus, yes; and Rappl, yes. Motion carried.

Council Member Rappl motioned, and Council Member Ideus seconded to declare a JCB Backhoe as surplus property. Roll call vote Rappl, yes; Ideus, yes; Krejci, yes; Nagle, yes; Warford, yes; and Sweet, yes. Motion carried.

Council Member Warford motioned, and Council Member Nagle seconded to approve a Waiver of Separate Submittals for preliminary and Final Plats for Menn Commercial Park First Replat, a replat of lots 2 and 3, Menn Commercial Park to the City of Wahoo, Saunders County, Nebraska. Roll call vote Warford, yes; Nagle, yes; Sweet, yes; Krejci, yes; Ideus, yes; and Rappl, yes. Motion carried.

Ordinance No. 2434 was introduced by Council Member Warford entitled: AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF WAHOO, SAUNDERS COUNTY, NEBRASKA, TO AMEND TITLE XI: ADMINISTRATION OF THE WAHOO MUNICIPAL CODE BY THE AMENDMENT OF CHAPTER 114: AMUSEMENT, SECTION 114.50-114.54.

Council Member Warford moved that the statutory rules in regard to the passage and adoption of ordinances be suspended so that the said ordinance might be introduced, read by title, and then moved for final passage at the same meeting. Council Member Ideus seconded said motion. The Mayor put the question and instructed the Clerk to call for the roll for the vote thereon. The Clerk called the roll, and the following was the vote on the motion to suspend the rules: Roll call vote Warford, yes; Ideus, yes; Krejci, yes; Nagle, yes; Rappl, yes; and Sweet, yes. Motion carried. The motion having been carried by the affirmative votes of no less than three-fourths of the members of the Council, the Mayor

declared the statutory rules in regard to the passage and approval of ordinance be suspended so that Ordinance No. 2434 may be read by title and moved for final passage in the same meeting.

Council Member Warford moved that Ordinance No. 2434 be approved and passed, and its title agreed to. Council Member Ideus seconded the motion. The Mayor instructed the Clerk to call the roll for the vote and the following was the vote on this motion: Roll call vote Warford, yes; Ideus, yes; Krejci, yes; Nagle, yes; Rappl, yes; and Sweet, yes. Motion carried.

Council Member Krejci motioned and Council Member Sweet seconded to approve the Authorization for City Administrator to sign Underwriting Engagement and Disclosure Letter with D.A. Davidson for permanent financing for North Highlands Subdivision infrastructure improvements and interim financing for the Wilmer Ridge Subdivision infrastructure improvements. Roll call vote Krejci, yes; Ideus, yes; Sweet, yes; Warford, yes; Rappl, yes; and Nagle, yes. Motion carried.

Council Member Warford was excused from the meeting at 8:05pm.

WHEREAS, the Interlocal Cooperation Agreement for a Mutual Finance Organization would be in the best interests of all participating members; and,

WHEREAS, the members desire to enter into a written Interlocal Cooperation Agreement for a Mutual Finance Organization

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Mayor and City Council of the City of Wahoo, Nebraska:

Section 1. The Interlocal Cooperation Agreement for a Mutual Finance Organization is hereby approved, ratified and accepted, and the Mayor of the City of Wahoo, Nebraska is hereby authorized, directed and empowered to execute the same;

Section 2. The Interlocal Cooperation Agreement for a Mutual Finance Organization shall not establish a separate legal entity, but rather shall be a joint and cooperative undertaking between the members and that a joint board shall be responsible for administering this joint and cooperative undertaking.

Section 3. All resolutions or parts of resolutions in conflict herewith are repealed.

Wahoo Intersection MISC-77-6(1080); CN 13502

PUBLIC INFORMATION OPEN HOUSE MEETING THURSDAY, APRIL 27, 2023

LOCATION Identified as *Wahoo Intersection*, the proposed project would build a roundabout at the intersection of US Highway 77 (US-77) and Nebraska Highway 109 (N-109) in Saunders County. Construction may begin and/or end approximately 2,500 feet ahead of or beyond the actual project limits to accommodate striping the pavement.

PURPOSE AND NEED ➤ The purpose of the proposed project is to reduce the frequency and severity of crashes at the junction of US-77 and N-109, improve the reliability of the transportation system, and perpetuate the mobility of the traveling public. The need for this project is based on current crash trends present at the intersection.

SCOPE OF WORK The planned construction would consist of removing the existing pavement and replacing it with doweled concrete pavement with integral curb. Additional work would include curb inlets, storm sewer, and lighting updates. Existing utilities would be reconstructed or relocated as needed.

RIGHT-OF-WAY The proposed project would require the acquisition of additional property rights, which could include new right-of-way (ROW), control of access (CA), permanent easements (PE), and/or temporary easements (TE). If your property is impacted by this proposed project, you would be contacted by a representative once the design footprint has been established. Access to adjacent properties would be maintained during construction but may be limited at times due to phasing requirements. Access to driveways may be limited at time due to phasing requirements.

POTENTIAL IMPACTS Lake Wanahoo and the Wahoo Municipal Airport are located in the vicinity of the proposed improvements; no impacts are anticipated.

ACCOMMODATION OF TRAFFIC & DETOUR

Construction of the proposed project would be phased with segments closed and traffic detoured. The project would be built in three phases.

Phase 1 would build the southern half of the roundabout. Old Highway 77 traffic would be detoured. No left turns would be allowed at the intersection. A designated detour for local traffic would be provided utilizing N Chestnut Street, E 12th Street, and Old Highway 77.

Phase 2 would build the center section of the roundabout. No left turns would be allowed at the intersection.

Phase 3 would complete construction, and N-109 traffic would be detoured. A designated detour for N-109 would be provided using US-77.

Traffic on US-77 would not be detoured.

THIS DRAFT ORDINANCE WILL BE UPDATED WITH CORRECT DISTRICT DESCRIPTIONS, NUMBERS, AND COSTS.

AN ORDINANCE AUTHORIZING THE ISSUANCE AND SALE OF BOND ANTICIPATION NOTES OF THE CITY OF WAHOO, NEBRASKA, OF THE PRINCIPAL AMOUNT OF NOT TO EXCEED TWO MILLION FOUR HUNDRED FIFTY THOUSAND DOLLARS (\$2,450,000) FOR THE PURPOSE OF PROVIDING INTERIM FINANCING FOR A PORTION OF THE COSTS OF CONSTRUCTING IMPROVEMENTS IN STREET IMPROVEMENT DISTRICT NO. 2023-1 AND IN STORM WATER SEWER DISTRICT 2023-1, PENDING THE ISSUANCE OF PERMANENT GENERAL OBLIGATION BONDS; PRESCRIBING THE FORM OF SAID NOTES; AGREEING TO ISSUE GENERAL OBLIGATION BONDS TO PAY THE NOTES AT MATURITY OR TO PAY THE NOTES FROM OTHER AVAILABLE FUNDS; FIXING CERTAIN TERMS OF THE NOTES AND AUTHORIZING THE FIXING OF OTHER TERMS OF THE NOTES; ENTERING INTO A CONTRACT ON BEHALF OF THE CITY WITH THE HOLDERS OF SAID NOTES; AND PUBLISHING THE ORDINANCE.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE MAYOR AND CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF WAHOO, NEBRASKA:

- Section 1. The Mayor and City Council of the City of Wahoo, Nebraska (the "City") hereby find and determine:
- (a) That by an Ordinance of the City heretofore adopted, Street Improvement District No. 2023-1, (the "Street Improvement District") has been created; that JEO, the engineers for the City, have prepared estimates for the cost of construction of certain street and related improvements in the aforesaid District; that bids have been opened and tabulated; that the City has entered into contracts for construction of the improvements; and, that there has been placed on file the City's engineer's estimate showing that the City's costs, including costs of engineering and costs of issuance and underwriting and a portion of interest to accrue on the Notes authorized herein during construction, will be not less than \$_____;
- (b) That by a resolution of necessity of the City heretofore adopted, Storm Water Sewer District No. 2023-1, (the "Storm Water Sewer District" and together with the Street Improvement District, the "Districts") has been created; for certain storm sewer and related improvements in the Storm Water District, that JEO, the engineers for the City, have prepared estimates for the cost of construction of certain street and related improvements in the aforesaid District; that bids have been opened and tabulated; that the City has entered into contracts for construction of the improvements; and, that there has been placed on file the City's engineer's estimate showing that the City's costs, including costs of engineering and costs of issuance and

underwriting and a portion of interest to accrue on the Notes authorized herein during construction, will be not less than \$

- that it is necessary for the City to have funds available to meet its payment obligations under the terms of contracts for the cost of the improvements to be constructed relative to the aforesaid Districts and to provide for payment of a portion of the interest accruing on the Notes authorized herein prior to their maturity, pending the completion of improvements and issuance of permanent financing pursuant to Sections 17-516, 17-520, 17-925, 18-1801 and 18-1802, R.R.S. Neb., as amended, and other applicable Sections; that the City has authority under Section 10-137, R.R.S. Neb., as amended, to issue notes for the purpose of providing interim financing for the construction of said improvements, including a portion of the interest to accrue on such notes and the costs of issuance thereof, all as set out above; that all conditions, acts and things required by law to exist or to be done precedent to the issuance of Bond Anticipation Notes; that to provide for payments of a portion of said total costs, it is now necessary to issue Bond Anticipation Notes in the amount of not to exceed \$2,450,000, to pay a portion of the costs of the aforesaid improvements, the costs of issuance of said notes and a portion of the interest to accrue on said notes, do exist and have been done as required by law.
- Section 2. For the purpose of providing interim financing for a portion of the costs set out in Section 1 pending the issuance of permanent General Obligation Various Purpose Bonds by the City, there shall be and there are hereby ordered issued bond anticipation notes of the City of Wahoo, Nebraska, to be known as "Bond Anticipation Notes" of the aggregate principal amount of not to exceed Two Million Four Hundred Fifty Thousand Dollars (\$2,450,000) (herein referred to as the "Notes" or the "notes"), consisting of fully registered notes numbered from 1 upwards in the order of issuance, in the denomination of \$5,000 each, or integral multiples thereof. The Notes shall bear interest at the rates per annum and become due and bear such other terms as set forth in a designation of final terms, which may be in the form of a note purchase agreement, (the "Designation") subject to and in accordance with the following:

The Mayor or City Administrator/Treasurer (each, an "Authorized Officer") may negotiate for the sale of the Notes in one or more series with an underwriting discount or placement agent fee of not more than 1.00% of the principal amount thereof (which sale price may be

adjusted to take into account any original issue discount or original issue premium), with D.A. Davidson & Co. (the "Underwriter") serving as underwriter or placement agent, as determined by an Authorized Officer. In connection with and as a part of such sale or sales, an Authorized Officer shall fix (which may be done in connection with a Purchase Agreement between the City and the Underwriter or bank) (a) the series designation of such series of Notes; (b) the final maturity of such series of the Notes, which shall not be later than December 15, 2029; (c) the principal amount of such series of the Notes; provided, however that the aggregate stated principal amount of all series of Notes shall not exceed the aggregate stated amount of \$2,450,000 but may be less than that amount; (d) the rate or rates of interest to be borne by each maturity of such series of the Notes, provided that the Notes shall not bear interest at a true interest cost in excess of 4.75% per annum; (e) the date or dates upon which semiannual interest shall be payable, and the record date for the purpose of determining the owners of each series of the Notes for the payments of interest; (f) the date or dates upon which such series of the Notes will be subject to redemption at the option of the City; (g) the identity of the Paying Agent and Registrar for each series of the Notes and the form and contents of any agreement or agreements under which the Paying Agent and Registrar would serve in such respective capacities with respect to each series of the Notes; (h) whether the Notes are sold pursuant to an underwritten transaction or a direct placement with a bank; and (i) all such other terms and provisions of the Notes not otherwise fixed or established by this Ordinance.

Interest on the Notes shall be payable on such dates as shall be determined in the Designation. The principal of said notes and any interest due on said notes upon maturity or earlier call for redemption shall be payable at the office of the Paying Agent and Registrar (identified herein), upon presentation and surrender of the note or notes when due or when called for payment prior to maturity. The payment of interest on said notes, falling due prior to maturity or call for redemption, shall be made by the Paying Agent and Registrar to the registered owners by mailing payment to the address of such registered owner or owners thereof as such address shall appear on the note register maintained by said Paying Agent and Registrar. The record date for each interest payment date (the "Record Date") shall be the fifteenth day immediately preceding the interest payment date. Payments of interest shall be mailed to the registered owner of each note as of the Record Date for each interest payment date.

Section 3. The City Treasurer, Wahoo, Nebraska, (or such other entity as may be determined in the Designation) is hereby designated as Paying Agent and Registrar for the Bond Anticipation Notes herein ordered issued and is hereby authorized to make payments of interest and principal from funds available for such purposes as provided herein as the same fall due. The Paying Agent and Registrar shall keep and maintain for the City books for the registration and transfer of the Notes. The names and

registered addresses of the registered owner or owners of the Notes shall at all times be recorded in such books. Any Note may be transferred pursuant to its provisions by said Paying Agent and Registrar by surrender of such Note for cancellation, accompanied by a written instrument of transfer, in form satisfactory to said Paying Agent and Registrar, duly executed by the registered owner in person or by his duly authorized agent, and thereupon the Paying Agent and Registrar on behalf of the City will deliver (or send by registered mail to the transferee owner or owners thereof at such transferee owner's or owners' risk and expense), registered in the name of such transferee owner or owners, a new note or notes of the same series, interest rate, aggregate principal amount and maturity. To the extent of the denominations authorized for the notes by this ordinance, one note may be transferred for several such notes of the same series, interest rate and maturity, and for a like aggregate principal amount, and several such notes may be transferred for one or several such notes, respectively of the same series, interest rate and maturity and for a like aggregate principal amount. In every case of transfer of a note, the surrendered note shall be canceled and destroyed. All notes issued upon transfer of the notes so surrendered shall be valid obligations of the City evidencing the same obligations as the notes surrendered and shall be entitled to all the benefits and protection of this ordinance to the same extent as the notes upon transfer of which they were delivered. The City and said Paying Agent and Registrar shall not be required to transfer any note during any period from any Record Date until its immediately following interest payment date or to transfer any note called for redemption for a period of 30 days next preceding the date fixed for redemption.

Section 4. Said Notes shall be executed on behalf of the City with the manual or facsimile signatures of the Mayor and Clerk and shall have the City's seal imprinted or impressed on each Note. Said Notes shall not be valid and binding on the City until authenticated by the Paying Agent and Registrar. The City and the Paying Agent and Registrar shall not be required to transfer any Note during the period from any Record Date to the next following interest payment date transfer any Note called for redemption for a period of 30 days next preceding the date fixed for redemption.

Section 6. Each of the Notes shall be executed on behalf of the City with the manual or facsimile signatures of the Mayor and the City Clerk and shall have imprinted thereon the City's seal. Is sold pursuant to an underwritten transaction with the Underwriter, the Notes shall be issued initially as "book-entry-only" notes using the services of The Depository Trust Company (DTC), with one typewritten note certificate per maturity being issued to DTC. - (d) Notwithstanding any other provision of this Ordinance to the contrary, so long as any Note is registered in the name of the Depository or any nominee thereof, all payments with respect to such Note and all notices with respect to such Note shall be made and given, respectively, to the Depository as provided in the Letter of Representations.
- (e) Registered ownership of the Notes may be transferred on the books of registration maintained by the Paying Agent and Registrar, and the Notes may be delivered in physical form to the following:
 - (i) any successor securities depository or its nominee;
 - (ii) any person, upon (A) the resignation of the Depository from its functions as depository or (B) termination of the use of the Depository pursuant to this Section.
- (f) In the event of any partial redemption of a Note unless and until such partially redeemed Note has been replaced in accordance with the provisions of Section 2 of this ordinance, the books and records of the Paying Agent and Registrar shall govern and establish the principal amount of such Note as is then outstanding and all of the Notes issued to the Depository or its nominee shall contain a legend to such effect.

If for any reason the Depository resigns and is not replaced, the City shall immediately provide a supply of printed note certificates for issuance upon the transfers from the Depository and subsequent transfers or in the event of partial redemption. In the event that such supply of certificates shall be insufficient to meet the requirements of the Paying Agent and Registrar for issuance of replacement Notes upon transfer or partial redemption, the City agrees to order printed an additional supply of certificates and to direct their execution by manual or facsimile signature of its then duly qualified and acting Mayor and City Clerk of such City. In case any officer whose signature or facsimile thereof shall appear on any Note shall cease to be such officer before the delivery of such Note (including any note certificates delivered to the Paying Agent and Registrar for issuance upon transfer or partial redemption), such signature or such facsimile signature shall nevertheless be valid and sufficient for all purposes the same as if such officer or officers had remained in office until the delivery of such Note. Davidson & Co., and its agents, representatives and counsel (including the City's bond counsel for the Notes) are hereby authorized to take such actions on behalf of the City as are necessary to effectuate the closing of the issuance and sale of the Notes, including, without limitation, authorizing the release of the Notes by the Depository at closing. The officers of the City, or any one or more of them are hereby further authorized to take any and all actions and enter into any and all agreements deemed necessary or appropriate in connection with the issuance and sale of the Notes, and any such actions previously taken are hereby ratified and confirmed.

Section 7. The proceeds of the Notes will be used to pay costs of the improvements described in Section 1 hereof, and may be used to pay costs of issuance of the Notes and a portion of interest accrued on the Notes. The City covenants and agrees that it will take all steps required to complete the improvements described in Section 1 hereof in a manner to allow it to issue and sell its Various Purpose Bonds or other bonds. The City further covenants and agrees to issue and sell its Various Purpose Bonds or other bonds in a sufficient amount and at such times as will enable it to take up and pay off the Notes herein authorized, both principal and interest, at or prior to maturity, to the extent not paid from other sources.

Section 8. The City hereby reserves the right to issue additional bond anticipation notes for the purpose of paying the balance of the cost of the projects of the City set out in Section 1 hereof, for the

purpose of refunding the Notes herein ordered issued at or prior to maturity and for the purpose of paying for additional improvements for the City.

Section 9. The City Clerk shall make and certify a complete transcript of the proceedings had and done by said City precedent to the issuance of said Notes, a copy of which shall be delivered to the initial purchaser of the Notes. After being executed by the Mayor and Clerk said Notes shall be delivered to the City Treasurer who shall be responsible therefor under her official bond. The City Treasurer is authorized and directed to deliver said Notes to the purchaser upon receipt of payment of the purchase price in accordance with the contract of the City with said purchaser.

Section 10. The City hereby covenants to the purchasers and holders of the Notes, that it will make no use of the proceeds of said Notes issue, including money held in any sinking fund attributable to said Notes which would cause said Notes to be arbitrage bonds within the meaning of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as amended, and further covenants and agrees to take all actions necessary under current federal law to maintain the tax-exempt status (as to taxpayers generally) of interest payable on the Notes. The City hereby authorizes the Authorized Officers to designate the Notes as the City's qualified tax-exempt obligations under Section 265(b)(3)(B)(i)(III) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as amended, and to covenant and warrant, on behalf of the City, that the City does not reasonably anticipate issuance of tax-exempt bonds or other obligations, not including private activity bonds (other than qualified 501(c)(3) bonds), in the aggregate principal amount of more than \$10,000,000 in calendar year 2023. The City agrees to take all further actions, if any, necessary to qualify the Notes herein authorized for such treatment if available.

Section 11. If any section, paragraph, clause or provision of this Ordinance shall be held invalid, the invalidity of such section, paragraph, clause or provision shall not affect any of the other provisions of this ordinance.

Section 12. All ordinances, resolutions or orders, or parts thereof, in conflict with the provisions of this Ordinance are to the extent of said conflict hereby repealed.

Section 13. The Authorized Officers (or any one or more of them) are hereby authorized to approve, deliver and deem final a Preliminary Official Statement and a final Official Statement with respect to the Notes for and on behalf of the City, all in accordance with the requirements of Reg. Sec. 240.15c2-12 of the Securities and Exchange Commission.

Section 14. The City hereby (a) authorizes and directs that an Authorized Officer execute and deliver, on the date of issue of the Notes, a continuing disclosure undertaking in accordance with the requirements of Rule 15c2-12 promulgated by the Securities and Exchange Commission (the "Rule") in such form as determined necessary and appropriate by such Authorized Officer (the "Continuing Disclosure Undertaking") and (b) covenants and agrees that it will comply with and carry out all of the provisions of the Continuing Disclosure Undertaking. Notwithstanding any other provision of this resolution, failure of the City to comply with the Continuing Disclosure Undertaking shall not be considered an event of default hereunder; however, any Participating Underwriter (as such term is defined in the Continuing Disclosure Undertaking) or any Beneficial Owner or any Registered Owner of a Note (as such terms are defined in the Continuing Disclosure Undertaking) may take such actions as may be necessary and appropriate, including seeking mandamus or specific performance by court order, to cause the City to comply with its obligations under this section, and under the Continuing Disclosure Undertaking.

Section 15. All documents, agreements, certificates, and instruments related to the Notes shall be valid, binding, and enforceable against the City when executed and delivered by means of (i) an original manual signature; (ii) a faxed, scanned, or photocopied manual signature, or (iii) any other electronic signature permitted by electronic signatures laws, including any relevant provisions of the Uniform Commercial Code, in each case to the extent applicable. Each faxed, scanned, or photocopied manual signature, or other electronic signature, shall for all purposes have the same validity, legal effect, and admissibility in evidence as an original manual signature. Each document, agreement, certificate, and instrument related to the Notes may be executed in any number of counterparts, each of which shall be

deemed to be an original, but such counterparts shall, together, constitute one and the same document, agreement, certificate, or instrument, as applicable.

Section 16. This Ordinance shall be published in pamphlet or electronic form as provided by law. This Ordinance shall take effect immediately upon its publication in pamphlet form.

BETWEEN THREE RIVERS PUBLIC HEALTH DEPARTMENT AND WAHOO FIRE AND RESCUE DEPARTMENT

It is recognized that the Three Rivers Public Health Department is engaged in the provision of vital public health programs and services that help citizens of Dodge, Saunders, and Washington counties live healthier lives. It is further recognized that the Three Rivers Public Health Department will be called upon to provide services during a public health emergency to protect the citizens of Dodge, Saunders, and Washington Counties from disease, disability, and death. To provide these vital services, the Three Rivers Public Health Department will need additional resources and support to conduct effective emergency response activities.

<u>Wahoo</u> Fire and Rescue Department is well suited to support public health emergency response efforts and <u>Wahoo</u> Fire and Rescue Department wishes to declare its intention to support the community during a public health emergency and assist in response efforts. In the event of a public health emergency Fire and Rescue Department intends to assist the Thee Rivers Public Health Department and provide the following to make medications available to its employees and their families:

- 1. **ACTION:** When requested, the <u>Wahoo</u> Fire and Rescue Department will provide emergency medical assistance and the transportation of sick, injured, or convalescent persons to pre-designated local hospitals.
- 2. **EQUIPMENT AND SUPPLIES:** <u>Wahoo</u> Fire and Rescue Department may be requested to provide equipment and supplies necessary for emergency medical assistance of any sick, injured, or convalescent persons present at any distribution and dispensing sites.
- 3. **PROPERTY DAMAGE:** Three Rivers Public Health Department assumes responsibility for any damage sustained by the <u>Wahoo</u> Fire and Rescue Department caused by the Three Rivers Public Health Department or by any person on the premises during the implementation of large-scale disease control measures including mass dispensing, distribution and vaccination by Three Rivers Public Health Department.
- 4. **RELEASE OF LIABILITY:** The Three Rivers Public Health Department agrees to hold the <u>Wahoo</u> Fire and Rescue Department harmless from any damage or injury sustained by any person during the implementation of large-scale disease control measures including mass dispensing, distribution and vaccination by the Three Rivers Public Health Department.

It is agreed that nothing contained herein is intended or should be construed in any manner as creating or establishing a partnership or joint venture. Any human resources loaned by the organization for administering medication shall not be deemed as employees, agents or contractors of the Three Rivers Public Health Department for any purpose whatsoever, including but not limited to wages or salaries, insurance benefits, or other benefits.

Following a public health emergency, this Letter of Concurrence will be reviewed by both the Three Rivers Public Health Department and the <u>Wahoo</u> Fire Department. If agreeable at the time of the review, this Letter may be extended. Any necessary adjustments to reflect the expectations of each entity should be made at that time. In addition to this scheduled review, at any time there are organization changes that may impact the expectations of this Letter they will be conveyed to the contacts identified by this Letter as soon as possible.

To maximize efficiency, the Three Rivers Public Health Department and the Wahoo Fire and Rescue Department intend to designate the following individuals to serve as primary contacts for all significant communication between each entity.
