WHEREAS, it should be understood that by granting the City the ability to test the backflow prevention devices this is not intended to mean that the City shall hereafter be responsible for providing for the testing and/or warranting to individual property owners that their devices are functional or that no damages can incur as a result of the existence and testing of the devices in question.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF PUBLIC WORKS OF THE CITY OF WAHOO, NEBRASKA, AS FOLLOWS:

- 1. That the findings here and above made should be and are hereby made a part of this Resolution as if fully set forth at length herein.
- 2. That Section 53.73 of the Wahoo Board of Public Works Policy and Procedure Manual is amended to read as follows:

Testing, repair, or replacement of backflow devices shall be the responsibility of the owner, renter, or customer. Wahoo Utilities Cross Connection Officer shall be responsible for maintaining the required records and ordering the testing of installed devices. Failure to test and report the test results to Wahoo Utilities shall result in immediate termination of water services. The Board of Public Works may, at its discretion and in the interest of Wahoo Utilities and its customers, hire a Certified Backflow Operator to directly test customer backflow devices, with the cost of such service being passed through to the customers. If Wahoo Utilities elects to perform this testing, customers will not be required to conduct separate tests of their devices.

WHEREAS, the Board of Public Works of the City of Wahoo, Nebraska, has determined it appropriate to amend Section 52.40 to better clarify the City's current policies relating to electrical utility

installation expenses.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF PUBLIC WORKS OF THE CITY OF WAHOO, NEBRASKA, AS FOLLOWS:

- 1. That the findings here and above made should be and are hereby made a part of this Resolution as if fully set forth at length herein.
- 2. That Section 52.40 of the Wahoo Board of Public Works Policy and Procedure Manual is amended to read as follows:
- (A) General responsibilities The city, by the Board of Public Works, shall provide electric service to any customer in its service area. The city shall be responsible for all labor, material, and equipment necessary for the installation of residential electrical service wire up to the point of attachment and including the electrical meter. However, the customer shall be responsible for the installation of the meter socket, (which must be approved by the city), transformer pads, and mast (overhead service) or conduit, from meter socket to utility point of attachment (underground service), subject to the subsequent terms and conditions herein. The mast and/or conduit are to be supplied by the customer.
- (B) Primary service should the customer or developer desire electrical service either single or three phase, at a location that does not have the requested electrical service, then the customer or developer shall pay the city the amount of the facilities investment cost in excess of three times the estimated annual electric rate revenue of the customer or the development at completion.
- (C) All nonresidential customers shall provide & install conductors from the service equipment to the utilities secondary voltage subject to approval of the utilities and inspectors authority. Maintenance/repair of conductors shall be the responsibility of the property owner.
- (D) Secondary service for a General Service Two customer, the customer shall pay the city a fee equal to 50% of the total facilities investment cost.
- (E) For purposes of determining the fees, the electric customers with electric water and space heat which is supplemented by solar energy shall be considered all electric.
